

A LETTER FROM A SCHOOL VICE PRINCIPAL

Our school has been involved with Kids Hope for a number of years now and we plan to continue it for years to come. We could not speak more highly of the mentor program.

The program requires very little organisation and management as Kids Hope does the majority of the work. The hardest part for the school is trying to choose the students to participate in the program, as this program would benefit so many students.

Trying to find an hour a week in each student's schedule has not been a problem. The mentors are very flexible so the teachers find a time that will be of most benefit to the student.

If we find a student needs to catch up on schoolwork during their mentoring time, the mentor will spend some of the hour assisting the student to finish their schoolwork. We find that our students really enjoy completing their work with their mentors and benefit greatly from the one-on-one support.

We have absolutely no concerns with the level of screening and training of the Kids Hope mentors. Each mentor has a Working with Children's Check and have attended interviews before commencing the program. They are also involved in ongoing training to keep up to date with policies and guidelines.

We have developed a fantastic relationship with all the Kids Hope mentors who attend our school. We see them as another staff member who are always welcome in our school. The mentors come well prepared and organise a range of different activities. Such activities include, board games, outside games, cooking, craft and art.

We have other wellbeing support for our students but we find the Kids Hope program is that extra support for students who need that regular one on one support. We find the program to be quite unique in the sense that these students have a one-hour session every week with their mentor.

Our students have formed great relationships with their mentors and look forward to their weekly sessions. The improvement we have seen in our students have been outstanding.

One student started the program in Grade 1 and continued with the same mentor until she graduated in Grade 6. The relationship the student and mentor formed was so great to see. We saw massive improvements in this student's confidence, resilience and work ethic.

The mentors go above and beyond, attending graduations, school concerts and special persons days. Kids Hope is without a doubt one of our most valued programs.

We hope to continue to be involved in the program as long as possible and would recommend every school to get involved in the program if it is offered to them.
