Jan Drury from Elanora Uniting Church coordinated and mentored at Elanora State School


Melanie Petkovic from Pursuit Church Mornington coordinating and mentoring at Moorooduc Primary School

We do have one story we'd love to share right now. As mentioned, we honoured Tim Smith, our Community Engagement champion for his 10 years of loyal service at our recent volunteer event. You may not realise but he has helped start over 220 programs since he started with us. That is an extraordinary effort! We asked Tim a few questions regarding his time in his role.

## Why Kids Hope? Why do you do what you do?

We live in a world today where many kids are struggling with various social, environmental, and family challenges. But Kids Hope mentoring can make a difference by providing a glimmer of hope to these children in need. Hearing the amazing stories of impact is what drives me to continue to partner churches with schools to reach more children through the power of one-to-one mentoring.

## Do you have any highlights?

There are so many stories of impact. For example, the story of Bee and Marion. That's the heart of what we do. It's what excites me - knowing that our program really works! However, another highlight for me is the excitement of partnering a school with a church to establish a Kids Hope program. I enjoy seeing the culmination of lots of work, multiple communications and many meetings and discussions to finally see the program starting in a school. No matter how long it takes, the journey is always worth it! A principal made my day recently when he said, "We have thoroughly enjoyed and valued having the mentors in our school this year and we look forward to strengthening this partnership for 2023."

### Why should people get involved?

Because it works! The kids receive so much joy from the mentoring relationship. But we know that it's not just the kids. The mentors also get so much out of the program - knowing that they are making a difference. It is rewarding and impactful. The wellbeing departments of schools are stretched more than ever. So if a group of people from a local church can help with even just a few kids in a partner school, it's absolutely worth getting involved.
