

CHAIR'S REPORT

If ever we needed convincing that Kids Hope has a really important role to play in helping to bring confidence and hope to vulnerable children of primary school age, then this year has confirmed our purpose and value many times over. We invite you to read in this Annual Report, some of the many life-changing stories we hear.

School staff are now increasingly stretched and often stressed in the context of heightened child anxiety and risks of poor mental health and wellbeing. Homes are under more financial pressure from rising costs of living and pressure on housing affordability.

Our volunteer mentors remained faithful and committed around Australia to connect with their mentored kids despite the COVID restrictions and consequent meeting and communication challenges. Thank you so much to all our many volunteers - especially mentors - for your wonderful investment in precious, young lives.

For not-for-profits like Kids Hope, this past season in Australia was characterised by tighter conditions for resourcing and funding, resulting in increased pressure on our staff and the wider Kids Hope community. Churches have also been widely impacted, restricting their ability to support and fund many volunteer-based community services, such as Kids Hope. Our board-endorsed strategy for FY23 included: holding firm in supporting existing mentors and programs, focus on a regional growth area, and new foundations for efficient scaling of programs into the future.

Our team, under our CEO Gail Cameron's energetic leadership, has invested countless hours in supporting existing Kids Hope programs around Australia and focussed growth in two main areas. The first is the regional growth initiative in West Australia. We welcomed a new staff member to the team to launch and develop Kids Hope community engagement around Perth and the South West.



The second initiative laid foundations for digital transformation to scale our growth, enabling more efficient use of resources, communications and processes.

This foundational multi-year project was generously supported by a Capacity Building Grant. Once fully operational, the plan is to reach and train many more mentors, coordinators and churches, and to partner with complementary organisations to efficiently grow Kids Hope mentoring in thousands of schools.

We thanked John Altmann for his completion of nine dedicated years of service as a foundational Director of Kids Hope in Australia. CEO'S REPORT

In a complicated world, Kids Hope gives vulnerable kids a fighting chance. With a mentor in their corner, showing up once a week with care, consistency and fun, kids feel seen and valued, and grow in understanding that their lives matter. *Kids Hope forms a weekly* shelter in the storms of life for vulnerable kids and shines a light of hope into their future.

With nearly 20 years in operation, we are now beginning to hear back from formerly mentored kids, now adults! It is such a privilege to hear from these kids who have benefited from having a light of hope in their lives through mentoring! The stories of transformation are heart-warming and fuel our small team as we work hard behind the scenes to support teams of mentors going into schools.

Our longest standing staff member, Tim Smith celebrated 10 years of Kids Hope this year, and shared that it is the kids that keep him going. He recently presented at a church when a young lady came forward to register interest in mentoring. Why? Because she had been mentored herself as a young child and wanted to share the benefit with others! Kids Hope filled the gaps for this young lady when she might not otherwise have had anyone in her corner. And now she's able to share this hope with others - how amazing is that!

One of the many highlights for me this year was visiting current and prospective partners in West Australia. I had the privilege of visiting our largest Kids Hope partnership between North Beach Primary School and North Beach Baptist Church. I joined the Kids Hope team in serving 40 barista-made coffees to school staff (something they do every week!) and met directly with the Principal. He shared his overwhelming support for Kids Hope and said that he couldn't do what he does without his church across the street who had been a tremendous support to the staff and students.

This report will bring many exciting highlights of the impact that Kids Hope is having in our communities across Australia. We trust that you will be touched and inspired as you read.

The impact of Kids Hope is only possible with many contributors, in fact, thousands. We extend a huge thank you to our mentors, coordinators, school program contacts, prayer partners, financial supporters, staff, board directors, advocates, patrons and ambassadors. We couldn't do what we do without everyone doing their part, so thank you!

PROGRAM REPORT

It was a joy to hear that 99.7% of our mentors across the nation were once again able to attend face-to-face mentoring sessions. That amounts to 42,240 hours of smiles that spread across children's faces!

This is welcome news given the demand for mentors was once again on the increase. Schools have experienced the rising tide of anxiety in primary school children and are in desperate need of well-being support.

Professor Hudson, Chair of the Childhood Mental Health Research Plan Expert Advisory Panel stated that "children experienced increased mental health symptoms before COVID-19, but then COVID-19 made that grow exponentially." 1

Armed with this knowledge, last year we made the strategic decision to expedite our plans to increase our capacity. As a result, planning for the digital scaffolding required for rapid expansion was a key priority for our program and operations team. Once completed, our digital systems will provide the capacity and efficiencies required to meet the ever-increasing demand for mentor support in primary schools.

The requests for more mentors did not only occur in our current programs. We also had a flurry of new and returning programs. A total of 22 new school partnerships formed, which is a great result. With our expansion strategy in place we hope to see this number driven higher so that even more vulnerable children throughout Australia can benefit.

We respond with such determination not just because of COVID, but because the evidence clearly demonstrates that over 50% of mental health problems surface before puberty.¹ Our belief is that if we help prepare our young children's lives now, they will need less repairing later.

This value is tightly held by the 1056 volunteer mentors we have trained and supported throughout the year. Our program support team worked hard to resource and inspire mentors as they re-entered classrooms, supporting them through somewhat challenging times. And they flourished! The results are in. Our annual evaluation clearly demonstrates that our mentors make the difference children crave. You can read all about it in our Evaluation Report on page 8.

None of these results would be possible without the dedication and generosity of our many supporters, staff, church and school partners, and our Board. Thanks to them, we can continue to empower Aussie children to thrive through life-transforming one-to-one mentoring.

Absolute gold! That is how you could describe the many wonderful stories and comments that were captured in our Mentor and Teacher Evaluation Surveys.


With 94.11% of teachers saying the Kids Hope program had a positive impact on the health and wellbeing of their mentored children, the evidence clearly demonstrates the transformational power of one-to-one mentoring. One teacher captured this sentiment so simply by saying, "The mentor really makes a difference."

It's not just our mentored children who benefit from Kids Hope. As one chaplain said, "Kids Hope has really helped share the load of social and emotional support of students in the school. Meaning there's more time to invest in different students." Positively impacting one child's life inevitably creates a ripple effect. Teachers are happier and less stressed because they can then give their attention to other children in the classroom.

More children are then happier and motivated which encourages a better classroom environment. In turn, school leadership and other staff are inspired and motivated to also see positive change in other classrooms. This then initiates the spread of better behaviour and motivation throughout the school. Therefore, it's no surprise that a staggering 100% of teachers would recommend the Kids Hope program for other children.

Not only that, but the ripple effect spreads to home as well. Parents and guardians also notice a difference as their child starts to thrive. As one teacher stated, "The family of the mentored student feels supported. It takes a load off their back."

These incredible results would not be possible without the dedication, care and creativity of our amazing Kids Hope mentors.

They made every effort to connect with their mentored children - always finding new ways to inspire, motivate, care, and encourage. In fact, 92.5% of mentors said they had a strong, positive bond with their mentored child. That is an extraordinary amount of connection!

Often the support of mentors does not stop there. As financial demands continued to increase last year, many children and families were provided much needed food security. One mentor shared, "I was able to get to the school to ensure that my boy had lunch each day."


After so much disruption during COVID, getting to school every day was also a struggle for


many children. With the motivation to see their mentors, many children started to attend school more regularly. As another mentor observed, "He now attends school every day and mostly comes on time." And yet another mentor, "After the lockdowns, he has grown to see school as a good thing and a good place to be."


One-to-one mentoring changes kids' lives! Their self-esteem, confidence, optimism and resilience grow. Their ability to engage in positive interactions increases because they're learning how to self-regulate. They begin to feel a sense of social acceptance and connectedness.

FINANCIAL REPORT

In the 2023 financial year, we focused on capacity building for growth and program expansion in a new region. Growing strategic collaborative relationships led to doors opening in West Australia for Kids Hope. We seized this opportunity by investing in West Australia, with a focus on promoting Kids Hope, building and strengthening strategic relationships, and engaging new school and church partnerships.

We also embarked upon a significant capacity building project focusing on a new technology platform and digital resources, including a fantastic new website. This investment in capacity and efficient communications and processes will make it easier, simpler and faster for mentors and supporters alike to access resources and engage with the Kids Hope team. This investment in capacity building for growth translated to a planned surplus for year 1 to provide ample funds for the one-off, project-based budget deficit for this financial year. The funding was secured in advance so that the planned shortfall would be covered. You will see this reflected in the higher income in the previous year and the increase in expenses in this financial year.

We are incredibly grateful for the support of our partners who see the strategic benefits of investing in capacity building. This investment translates into growth of our structure and thus reach, and ultimately and most importantly, growth in the number of kids reached with hope!

A huge and heartfelt thank you to each and every one of you who continues to give generously so that kids and their communities will be empowered to thrive!

Jewell started mentoring 15 years ago and has led a team of up to 20 mentors. She strongly believes that mentoring lifts self-esteem and empowers vulnerable children to reach their full potential, moving them beyond their circumstances, knowing they are worthwhile and loved. And she is adamant to add that she has benefited as much as the children!

Jewell shared about a young girl she mentored who was completely withdrawn after the tragic suicide of her father. Time with Jewell, cooking and craft, provided an escape from her harsh circumstances. Thanks to Jewell's care, the girl began to engage with her classmates and schoolwork. By grade 6 she had blossomed into a compassionate and caring child. She's now nearly 18 years old and doing well! Jewell tells us, "Mentoring has nothing to do with how intellectual you are - you just need to be sincere and faithful." MELANIE PETKOVIC Pursuit Church, Mornington


Melanie has been mentoring for 5 years and in those years she and her team have had incredible impact, not only on individual kids, but also on the school community. When Melanie arrived, her mentored child couldn't handle being in the classroom. Her head was down, she refused to participate, and she kept leaving the class to hide in the bathroom. Her family life was complicated, with a marriage breakup, blended family, multiple relationships and more breakups. When her mum was then diagnosed with cancer, she became retaliative and nasty to her peers.

Melanie shared that it is just amazing what a difference one person could make with just one hour a week. She says, "The impact is like a pebble in a river, a ripple effect where the entire school community benefits." The mentors are loved by the school and are treated like members of the family. The principal has been so touched by the love and generosity expressed by the church, that when they met she became teary and couldn't speak. Instead, she wrote Melanie long emails to share her gratitude. Thank you Melanie, for your heart, care and service to the kids in your community!




